Bill is a real pleasure to have around as his laugh is infectious.



In the spotlight with BOMNET Member John Balding

I was born in Sydney in December 1942, and lived in Punchbowl for the first ten years of my life until the family moved to Coffs Harbour. Prior to our move I went through a number of operations, seven in total, over about the same number of years to remove a malignant tumour in my neck (cancer).

After living in Coffs Harbour for a short period of time I had a minor accident, a simple fall, and dislocated my left hip, though it went un-noticed for a while as I was in no pain, but did walk with a pronounced limp.

My mother knew there was something amiss, and she eventually convinced (read nagged) my father to take me to see a chidlrens orthopaedic specialist in Sydney. X-rays revealed that I had dislocated my left hip, and treatment to rectify the problem began almost immediately. I was in traction for six months at the Camperdown Children's Hospital in Sydney, and after that I was placed in a plaster cast from just under my left armpit, right down my torso to my left ankle, and was told I would be like this for twelve to eighteen months, and took up residence at the Far West Home in Manly for the recuperation period.

The eighteen months dragged on for three years with a number of trips back to Camperdown Children's Hospital to have the plaster cast changed...the majority of the three years was spent at the Far West Home in Manly. I returned to my home only once in that three year period, and only saw my mother just once in all that time as they just didn't have to money to get to Sydney...oh how I missed her. My father would get the occasional lift down to Sydney when he could; they were too poor to own a motor vehicle so he had to rely on the generosity of people visiting Sydney.

I did some schooling there in Manly at the Far West Home, albeit somewhat limited, and arrived back in Coffs Harbour at thirteen years of age just in time to start high school. After I completed High School I undertook an apprenticeship as a motor mechanic with the local Ford dealer, during which time I was married and we had a beautiful daughter, Kim.

My little family moved to Kempsey where I ran my own business, a combined mechanical workshop and service station, for a few years before moving to Bulolo, New Guinea, where I worked for the next three years or so as a diesel mechanic, servicing trucks and logging equipment.

It was my wife who suggested the move to New Guinea as she grew up there until she was of high school age, and loved the casual life style, and it was a wonderful place to raise children.

After spending three and a half years working in Bulolo

I was offered a position as a diesel fitter with an American based company on Bougainville Island, which I accepted, and spent the next eighteen months working for them rebuilding huge automatic transmissions and diesel engines in copper mining haulage equipment. At the end of my eighteen month contract I was offered a transfer to Mackay, where I was initially responsible for setting up workshop facilities to service the coal mining equipment operating in the Bowen Basin, to the west of Mackay.

I worked for this company for over ten years in the position of Central and North Queensland Service Manager, eventually responsible for workshop facilities in Rockhampton, Townsville and Mackay, where I was based.

After resigning from that company I started a home improvement business but eventually sold this due to the fact that I missed the automotive/mechanical business and moved back into the automotive industry for several years as the service manager for two different franchises in Mackay then switched over to sales and moved to the Gold Coast, where I worked until ill health (ongoing heart problems and degenerative osteo arthritis) forced me into early retirement at age fifty five.

After undertaking some community work for a few years I was bitten by the travel bug and took up caravanning. I've lost count of the number of caravans I've owned over the years, or the kilometres I've travelled with them. I've been right around the block twice, visited every state and territory in Australia, but still haven't seen it all.

I was divorced in 1998, and met my darling wife Bev in 2000. She lived in Sydney, and I lived in Toowoomba, but not for long as I made the move to Sydney to be with Bev. We were married in 2002, Bev retired the same week as we were married, and we moved into a brand new four bedroom home with all the extras in Hervey Bay to enjoy our retirement together and travel as much as we possibly could in our caravan.

Apart from travel, one other real passion was writing short fictional stories and tutoring creative writing at a number of U3A's in areas such as Coolangatta, Southport, Toowoomba and Penrith. I really enjoyed both writing and tutoring, but have done little of either for some time now except for newsletters. I was a member of the Gold Coast Writers Guild until I moved from Southport to Toowoomba.

newsletters. I was a member of the Gold Coast Writers Guild until I moved from Southport to Toowoomba.

Another passion was building and flying/sailing radio controlled model aircraft and model boats. Both of these interests certainly kept me busy, which was great whilst Bev was still working, but after she'd given up work travelling in our caravan took up most of our time, and model building was put on hold.

Music is another passion of mine, and when Bev and I lived in Sydney we were active members of the Sydney Jazz Club. I have a very eclectic taste in music, and not long after moving to Bundaberg we joined the Bundaberg Country Music Club. I no longer perform in public as I seem to have lost my confidence, however I'm still a member of the club.

After living in Hervey Bay for nine years we made the move to Bundaberg and have lived here now for the past three years. Our move was brought about by the fact that failing health left us with the feeling that we could no longer look after ourselves as far as cooking, housework and shopping were concerned, and we moved into an independent living village at North Bundaberg where meals were provided, and shopping was down to a bare minimum. It didn't take long to realise that we had made a huge mistake as we were very unhappy with this situation and a very dear friend, Anne Etherton, who we met as a result of our membership with the Bundaberg Country Music Club, found our current home for us and helped us move in.


The problem of cooking was solved as we now get nutritious frozen meals delivered to us on a regular basis by a company based on the Sunshine Coast, and house cleaning is carried out on a fortnightly basis by Oz Care... we even have a lady who takes care of our ironing.

I have a daughter and two grandsons who live on the Gold Coast, and Bev has a son and a daughter, plus three granddaughters, who all live in Sydney. Sadly, due to the distances involved, we don't get to see much of them anymore, and our health issues has put a stop to us visiting them. We've recently discovered Skype, so that does help us keep us in touch.

Health issues now means that our caravanning days are long over but I try and keep myself busy, mentally. I have a real interest in men's health issues, hence the reason I felt the need to establish something like the Bundaberg Older Men's Network (BOMNET) Inc, where "Older Men Support Older Men." I decided to talk to other aging men and men's shed members about this situation, and it wasn't long before we had rounded up a group of men

who shared the same passion. The Bundaberg Older Men's Network (BOMNET) Inc. was born in April 2014 with a core group of seven concerned men, and has gone ahead in leaps and bounds since then...I thank all the members of BOMNET for sharing the dream.

We owe much to TOMNET, The Older Men's Network in Toowoomba, for all the help they've given us to get us up and running, and the ongoing help they continue to provide along the way.


