The blokes from BOMNET welcome new members Mark Britton and Bernie O'Reilly who joined us in late January, early February.

Mark was born in Geelong, and his fist job was a gardener, which lasted twelve months. He then worked as a motor wrecker for five years before being asked to manage a motor cycle shop and also carry out motor cycle repairs for three years.

He then moved to Queensland where he took up sand blasting and spray painting for the next two years. Mark then worked as a trade assistant fitter on Navy and luxury boats before moving to Western Australia where he worked as pruner in a vineyard for twelve months and then took up farming work, including ploughing for wheat and barley, and working with sheep.

For the past seven years Mark has lived in Bundaberg and ill health has prevented him working.

Bernie was born at Cunnamulla in 1939 and raised on a sheep and cattle property near Charleville. After University in Brisbane he taught Science/Maths in Far North Qld High Schools from Mackay to Thursday Is and west to Normanton.

Bernie retired as Principal of a Cairns High School, and then spent the next eight years part time at the School of Distance Education ( School of the Air ) – the best years with wonderful, hardworking students and supportive parents. Along the way Bernie tried his hand at timber cutting, tobacco picking, diving for Trochus shell, professional reef fishing.

Bernie and wife Pam have a son and daughter and six grandchildren. They recently moved from Cairns to Bundaberg seeking a better climate and new friends.

#### In the spotlight with BOMNET Member John Scarbrow

It was almost wartime, when I was born in London and named John. Uncle Jack, a bachelor, asked to pick a second name. As he learnt over the crib, I scratched him, thus the name, LIONel.

We grew up surrounded by bombed out buildings. When the bombers came over, we hid under the stairs, me in the arms of Ivy, a good looking blonde, from the top flat.

My education was at Wolverstone boarding school in Suffolk. The village of Wolverstone was named after a Viking chieftain, named Wolf, back in history. He used the stone to decapitate his enemies. Like '' Don't be nervous, put your head on the stone, close your eyes and make a wish''. Instead of wish one heard swish, as his axe loosens the enemy's head. This was the reason the village is called Wolverstone, and is situated about 10 miles, south of Ipswich, the market town of Suffolk in England.

Leaving school, no career advice was offered, probably because the teachers were squares in round holes, themselves. They excelled with the cane and a golf club on the bum, near the testicles!

Employed by the Blue Star Line, my first job was sweeping the floor and licking stamps. Fiddling the stamps was a company tradition. A genuine 2/6d stamp to Australia, became a 5/6d stamp in the books. Profit 3 shillings. The general manager told us to tone it down, when we became too greedy!

I was promoted to the forwarding department, finalising documents for our refrigerated imports from Australia, New Zealand and Argentina.

I left that company, as I could not see any future for me and joined a paper convertor company, as export assistant. Within 2 years I was Export Manager. The company was taken over by a Bolton manufacturer in northern England, and the boss was a Polish bloke, who was a wartime spitfire pilot. He asked me to come up and sent a chauffeured Rolls Royce to ferry me up and then down. Bolton was industrial and dirty and no place for me so I resigned.

My wife at that time had a young daughter living in Wales with grandparents, so we looked there. Eventually we borrowed money and bought an old farmhouse on the banks of a pristine river, where wild salmon, all the way from Canada, came to spawn. The place was idyllic, it had to be bought! A shock came when the spinster sisters moved their furniture out and all the plaster fell from the interior walls!

And then a worst shock, this part of Wales was Welsh speaking, and Welsh nationalism was rife, like "Go home English swine". I had a family of four at that time, and no job.

After many knockbacks, an interview for a receptionist at a Ford dealership and the manager was English, Mr. Cannard. I got the job. Cannard in French means duck, so you can understand that I don't eat duck!

The natives became good friends as beer is an international language!

Employment chances there would be limited for my daughters, so I applied for Australia. On April, 1972, we sailed on a Greek vessel, the 'Australis' and disembarked in Sydney. We were accommodated at a hostel in Maroubra. After jobs as a workshop controller at Woodham Ford, and a company supplying parts to mining companies, I applied for a sales position with a clothing company and got it as Sales coordinator. From there I was Warehouse manager, sales rep, and then national sales and marketing manager, which included trips to mostly S.E.Asia to buy fabrics. That company was shut down by H.M. Customs. I then sold clothing as a sales agent on 6% commission, but times were hard so why not Bundaberg?

My wife Zaira's parents lived there. We bought 60 acres at Baffle Creek. We had to earn money so we tried crops. Firstly 6 x 60m rows which was good. We couldn't afford a tractor so our only machine was a dented wheel barrow, which dented when I felled a tree which fell the wrong way!

Soon we had  $20 \times 60 \text{m}$  rows of tomatoes, bullhorns, zucchini etc. On our hands and knees we picked the lot and sent them to markets in Brisbane and Sydney. We then had 100 mango trees and  $6 \times 30 \text{m}$  rows of passionfruit.

In the meantime, we had put up a 2 bedroom kit home which later we air conditioned in the lounge. After 10 years of PRIDE & PAIN, we had to sell. The money from the sales enabled us to buy in Bundaberg. Not bad for city slickers?

I first saw BOMNET advertised in the Guardian, which I don't usually read. I had been trying various organisations to join but none were too my liking. I phoned our honourable president and he invited me to attend. My first thoughts were perhaps I had joined the BOBNET



as three of the members are named Bob, but brushed that aside as this mob was friendly and I saw intelligence in their eyes. nated, and it's a shame seeing them going unused most of the time as they all get the mind working, and you know the old saying "Use it or lose it"






