

### **SCAM OF THE MONTH - THE TECH SUPPORT CALL**

**Tech support scams** are unfortunately common occurrences where scammers pose as legitimate technical support representatives to gain access to personal information or money. They often use scare tactics, such as claiming your computer has a virus or malware, to convince you to provide access to your device or pay for unnecessary services.

#### To avoid falling victim to these scams:

- **1. Be Skeptical:** If someone contacts you claiming to be from tech support, be cautious, especially if you didn't initiate the contact.
- **2. Verify Identity:** Ask for the person's name, company, and contact information. Legitimate companies will provide this information.
- **3. Don't Give Control:** Never give control of your computer to someone who contacts you out of the blue. Legitimate tech support will not cold call you.
- **4. Use Reliable Services:** If you need tech support, contact the company directly using a number or email from their official website or documentation.
- **5. Keep Software Updated:** Keep your operating system, antivirus software, and other programs updated to minimise vulnerabilities.
- **6. Educate Yourself:** Learn about common scams and tactics used by scammers so you can recognise them.
- **7. Report Scams:** If you encounter a tech support scam, report it to the appropriate authorities. This can help prevent others from falling victim.

Remember, legitimate tech support representatives will never ask for your password or payment information unsolicited. If you're unsure, it's best to err on the side of caution and seek assistance from a trusted source.

### ARE YOU AT GREATER RISK IN A HOUSE FIRE?

Did you know that people aged 65 and over are at greater risk of being injured or dying in a house fire? Queensland Fire and Emergency Services - QFES has launched a new home fire safety campaign — Plan to survive. The campaign highlights the importance of having a home fire escape plan and interconnected photoelectric smoke alarms, to survive a home fire.

If you're an older person, or care for one, here are some simple steps you can take to help you escape:

- test your smoke alarms regularly and ask someone else to do it if you can't reach them
- if possible, sleep in a room on the ground floor to make escaping easier
- keep your wheelchair, walker or walking stick by your bed to help you escape faster
- keep a telephone nearby, with emergency phone numbers, so you can call Triple Zero (000)
- install a smoke alarm that uses lights and a vibrating pillow for anyone who is deaf or has a hearing impairment. You can order one through the Deaf Connect Smoke Alarm Subsidy Scheme https://deafconnect.org.au/com.../smoke-alarm-subsidy-scheme
- ensure any doors or windows with security bars have quick-release devices to open them immediately. These devices won't compromise your safety, but let you open the door or window from inside if there is a fire.

## **SMOKE ALARM SUBSIDY SCHEME (QLD)**

#### What is the Smoke Alarm Subsidy Scheme?

There is a subsidy available from the Queensland Fire and Emergency Service (QFES) for specialised smoke alarms to Deaf and hard of hearing people, who do not currently have an NDIS plan. It is managed by Deaf Connect and is called the Smoke Alarm Subsidy Scheme (SASS).

#### Who is eligible?

To be eligible for the subsidy you must be:

- Deaf or hard of hearing
- Living in Queensland
- Not on the NDIS

## SUPPORTING AND REMEMBERING **ANZAC DAY**


TOMNET Member Allan Jones represented TOMNET on ANZAC Day by laying a wreath at the Mother's memorial. thank you Allan.
