CAPTURING THE ESSENCE OF TOMNET: A DIGITAL STORY



Thank you to the Members who participated and shared their thoughts.





On 31st March, a special event was held to tackle the growing issue of social isolation among seniors living in

urban areas. People from Brisbane's inner city and nearby communities like Moreton Bay, Ipswich, Logan, Toowoomba, and Redland Bay came together to connect, share stories, and explore ways help older adults feel more included and supported.

The day was filled with inspiring talks from experts and seniors who shared their experiences with loneliness and the challenges of staying connected in busy city life. Attendees took part in group discussions and activities that encouraged everyone to

think about new and creative ways to bring people together.

The Older Mens Network facilitated a session on "How to engage older men

in Volunteering" and Anthony was invited to participate in a group panel discussing social isolation and ways to engage in our community.

The connections made and ideas shared will help guide future efforts to ensure seniors can enjoy active, happy, and lives.This connected event showed just how important it is for communities to come together and support their older members. With collaboration ongoing and fresh ideas, we can all help make sure no senior feels alone.



ary O'Brien, Founder and CEO of Are You Bogged Mate?, attended our April meeting and delivered a compelling message about the importance of looking out for one another and regularly checking in to see how our mates are coping.

Drawing on her experiences travelling across Australia, Mary shared personal



stories from her work **engaging with rural men** and advocating for those who often remain silent. Known for her straightforward approach, Mary spoke candidly about the confronting statistics of suicide in rural communities and sectors like construction, urging us to break the stigma and **start honest conversations**.




